Vintage Vibe Humbucker-Sized Single-Coils

TESTED BY DAVE HUNTER

IN A QUEST FOR HUMBUCKER-SIZED SINGLE-COIL ALTERNATIVES,

I turned to Pete Biltoft of Vintage Vibe pickups in Hawaii to see what he might be able to come up with. Vintage Vibe has a growing reputation for pickups that are not so much direct vintage recreations, but clever twists on several classic favorites that deliver unique tones in easily retrofitted sizes. Vintage Vibe pickups are also available with a wide range of stylish covers, such as the abalone tops featured in this selection. Among the four pairs to test were two sets of HS-90s (\$205 each) wound with 42 AWG and 43 AWG wire, respectively, the HS-AR with alnico poles (\$210), and an HCC set (\$210) designed to capture the hallowed Charlie Christian pickup in a humbucker size. In addition to the sets as they come, Vintage Vibe includes your choice of alternate magnets for each pickup, so you can make your own tone tweaks.

VINTAGE VIBE



Tested in a Koll Duo Glide through a Matchless HC-30 and a Bogner Goldfinger 45, the HS-90s wound with 42 AWG really nailed a traditional vintage-wind P-90 tone, with all that characteristic midrange grunt and a touch of uppermidrange grittiness. I particularly dug how the

alnico III magnets in the bridge pickup softened the spikes slightly, affording more buttery overdriven tones. The 43 AWG set copped a similar vibe, but with a more modern edge and some increased definition.

For more "alternative" alternatives, however,

the HS-ARs with alnico poles and the HCCs were real eye-openers. From beefy, Tele-like twang in the former to a lusciously slushy, fat-with-edge woodiness in the latter, these pickups took me farther than I could have imagined from the humbuckers that the Duo Glide's routes were made for, yet remained entirely musical and able to handle every style I threw at them.

All in all, these Vintage Vibe pickups provide four outstanding points of departure from standard humbuckers, and are definitely worth considering if you are looking to change up your sound with the help of some magnum-sized single-coils. vintagevibeguitars.com
